Dear Friends,

During this month of thanksgiving, the Turkic American Alliance is so grateful for your kindness, support and generosity that enables us to come together in friendship, in dialogue and in community.

Thanksgiving is a unique tradition in this country, though its essence is a universal one--gathering with loved and dear ones over delicious food, all the while giving thanks for life's bounty and blessings. It is a tradition that is not confined to any one religion or ethnicity in the United States--a true hallmark of this country's many great freedoms and humanitarian values. We are so grateful to be part of this remarkable mosaic.

The First Annual Kyrgyz American Convention was the highlight of the month, and the Rethink Institute published a related report, entitled "Two Decades of U.S.-Kyrgyz Relations." The publication is available at www.rethinkinstitute.org. Various TAA member organizations, such as ones from Maine, Massachusetts, Nebraska and Vermont, have organized Friendship & Dialogue Dinners and Award Ceremonies that hosted high-level local government officials such as Governors, Attorney Generals, Lieutenant Governors and Mayors. Additionally, member organizations around the U.S. organized Thanksgiving food drives to assist those in need during this holiday season.

Currently, there is an ongoing debate in Turkey about the government's plan to shut down private preparatory schools, or dershanes, which hundreds of thousands of high school graduates attend in order to pass Turkey's rigorous national college exam. For most students who cannot afford high quality private schools, prep schools are the only reliable and guaranteed way of entrance to higher education. Despite these many benefits, however, the Turkish government is deliberating over the closure of these dershanes and is doing so without much consultation of its many stakeholders. Furthermore, the public learned of the plan only after it was leaked to the press. We believe that the plan as it stands contradicts the democratic culture, pluralism, free enterprise, and freedom of education that is guaranteed in the Turkish Constitution and in other international charters to which Turkey is a signatory country. We strongly hope that the Turkish government will give heed to the massive public outcry that has ensued and drops this ill-advised plan.

Finally, be sure to read about the ways in which two sister organizations are providing relief services in the Philippines in the aftermath of the devastating Typhoon Haiyan. We hope and pray that the Philippines
