Dear Friends.

First of all, I would like to express my sadness over the news of demonstrations in Turkey. As Turkic American Alliance, we would like to urge the government officials and protesters to common sense. We would like to see restraint from both sides to avoid violence in nationwide protests that have gripped Turkey for more than a week. The demonstrations started out as a local environmental campaign in Taksim Square and quickly turned into anti-government demonstrations around the country. We believe that individuals deserve respect with their own preferences and faith. Taking these preferences into consideration by all political institutions, particularly the government is the guarantee of national peace.

On May 28-29, 2013, Baku hosted the "Azerbaijan-US: Vision for Future" convention co-organized by the Turquoise Council of Americans and Eurasians. Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev delivered the opening remarks to the audience including 11 Members of Congress and 200+ Legislatures from 42 States. The U.S-Azeri Convention was huge success overall with a record of 300+ high level officials attending.

Right after Baku, we organized the first ever Turkish-American Friendship Dinner in Istanbul on May 31, 2013, in partnership with TUSKON. Half of about 400 guests were from the US, including three Members of Congress, a Secretary of State and many state policy makers who interacted with top business people during the event. Turkish Deputy Prime Minister Ali Babacan was the keynote speaker.

Lastly, the fourth annual Anatolian Cultures and Food Festival returned at the Orange County Fairgrounds in California from May 16 through 19 expanding its portfolio to several other cities by adding new structures. It is a major cultural and historical event that includes exhibitions, food, arts & crafts, performances, dances, and live music activities --- simply a Turkey trip without a jetlag. More than 65,000 people from United States and people all around the world attended this year event.
