Dear Friends.

This month, 90 Members of the U.S. Congress responded to recent arrests of journalists and members of the media levied by the ruling party in Turkey by signing a letter showing "deep concern" to the U.S. Secretary of State, John Kerry. Similarly, an opinion piece titled "Turkey's Eroding Democracy" illustrating a sharp decline regarding human rights, rule of law and press freedom was published in the Washington Post. The opinion piece, written by Fethullah Gulen -- a well-renowned Islamic scholar, also explains how Turkey's current regime has "alienated the west and is losing credibility in the Middle East", and the role its needs to play in "asserting positive influence" within Turkey and its neighboring regions. The government also recently took control of Bank Asya -- a move that has drawn huge criticism and backlash from Turkish citizens fearing the takeover would negatively impact Turkey's financial industry.

In other news, three Muslim students were killed at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. The Turkic American Alliance sends its deepest condolences to the families and friends of the deceased and stands in solidarity with the Muslim community in condemning such horrific acts of violence. February also marked the 23rd anniversary of the Khojaly Tragedy, which saw 600 people killed, and is one of the biggest tragedies of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict. In commemoration, the Assembly of the Friends of Azerbaijan (AFAZ) held a reception in Washington D.C., attended by U.S. Members of Congress.

TAA attended annual Winter Meetings hosted by the National Association of Secretaries of State (NASS), National Governors Association (NGA) and National Association of Attorney Generals (NAAG).

The Mid-Atlantic Federation of Turkic American Associations (MAFTAA) held a Legislative Reception in Richmond, including a State House Reception in Kentucky while the Council of Turkic American Associations (CTAA) celebrated its 4th annual Turkic Day Celebrations in Maine. Turkic Cultural Day Held at Maine State House


